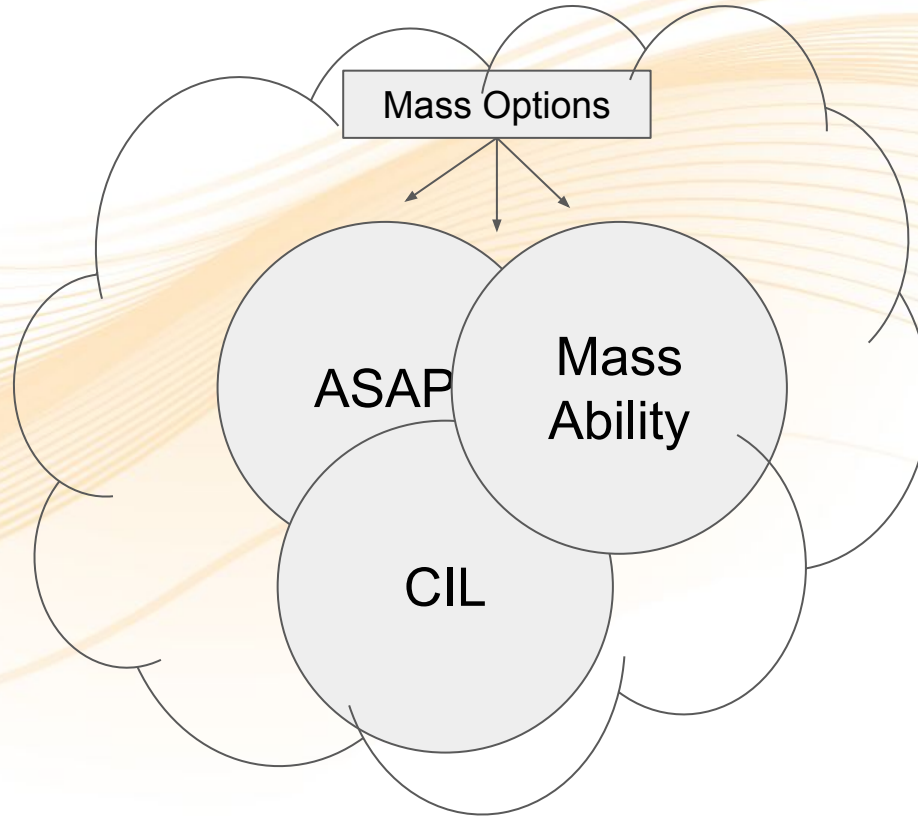

ADRCs provide unbiased, reliable information and counseling to people with all levels of income.

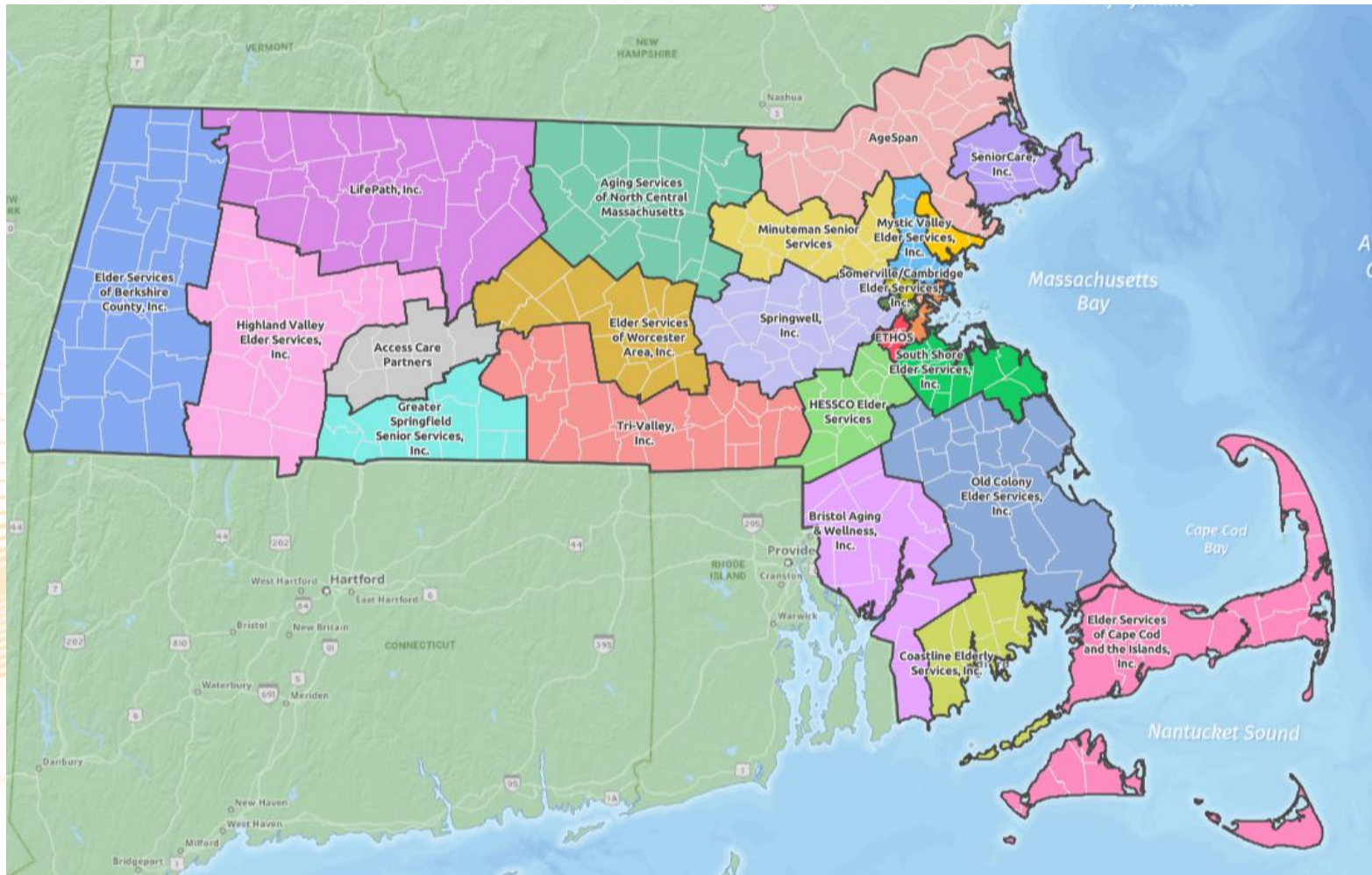
ADRCs are an important part of the [No Wrong Door \(NWD\)](#) system, a collaboration between ACL, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, and the Veterans Health Administration, the NWD initiative supports people working to streamline access to long-term services and supports for people with disabilities, and their families.

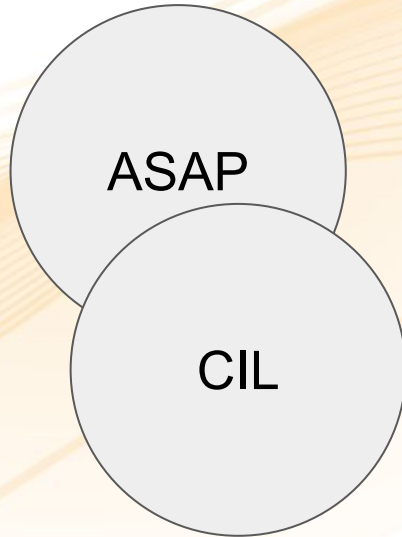


ASAP

Massachusetts ADRC Implementation



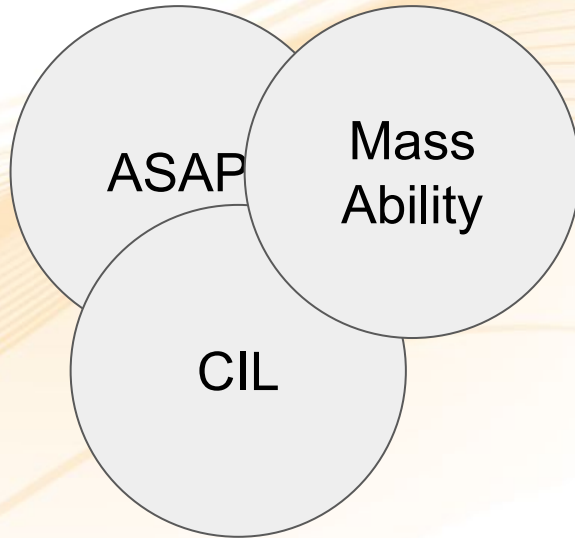
Centers for Independent Living

Overseen by Massachusetts Office on Disability (MOD)

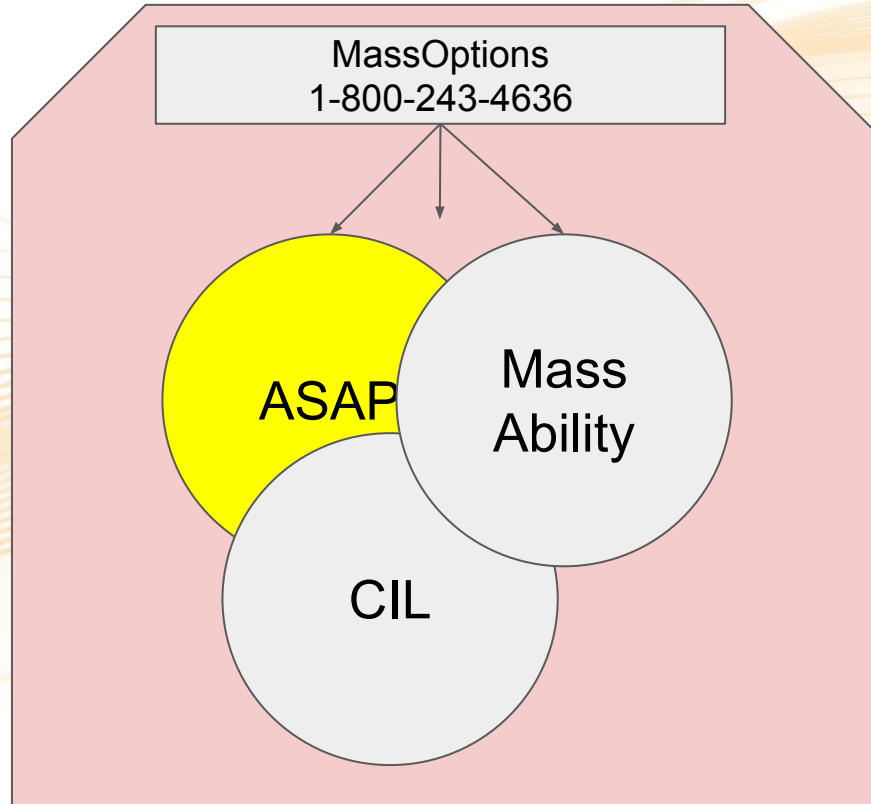

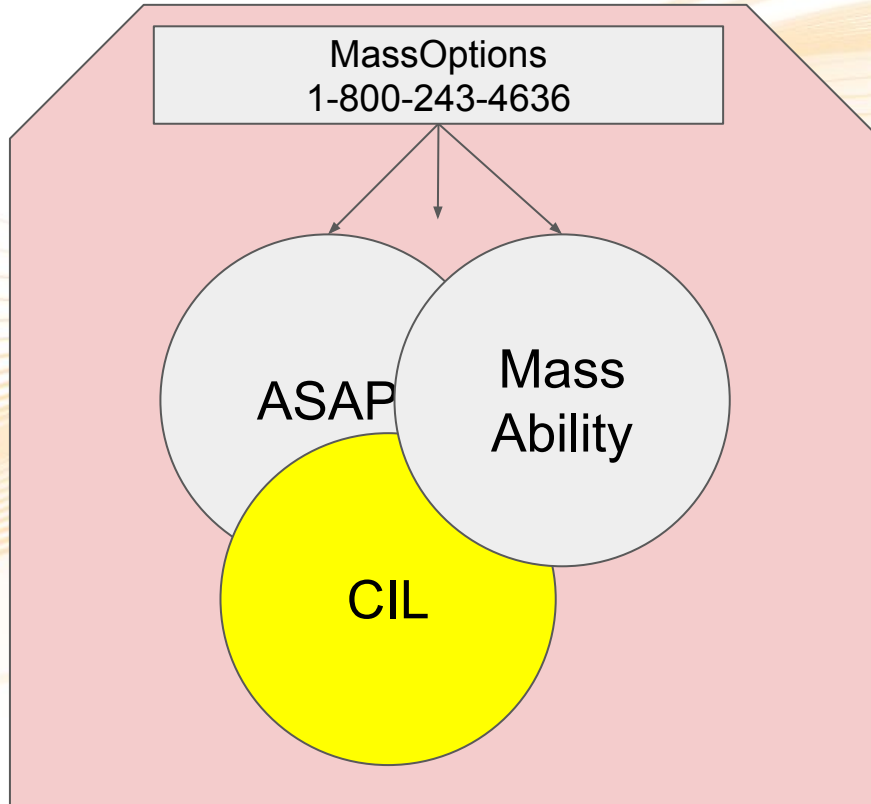
